## REFUGEE

### **UN 1951 Refugee Convention**

- A person who due to well founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, member of a particular social group or political opinion, is outside his country of nationality and is unable or owing to such fear unwilling to avail himself of the protection of that country
- Not having a Nationality and being outside the country of his former habitual residence

# 1969 OAU Convention Governing the Specific Aspects of refugees in Africa

 Owing to external aggression, occupation foreign dominion, or events seriously disturbing public order in either part or the whole of his country of origin or nationality, is compelled to leave his place of habitual residence in order to seek refuge in another place outside his country of origin or nationality

# **Internally Displaced Person (IDP)**

# 2009 AU Convention on the Protection and Assistance to IDPS (Kampala Convention)

- Persons or groups of persons who have been forced or obliged to flee or leave their home or places of habitual residence in particular as a result of or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflicts, situation of generalized violence, violations of human rights, or natural or human made disasters and who have not crossed an internationally recognized State Border
- Internal displacement means the involuntary or force movement, evacuation or relocation of persons or groups of persons within an internationally recognized state borders.

- Principle of Non-refoulement
- In Safety and Dignity
- Conditions for return

# Migrant

International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of ALL Migrants Workers and Members of their families

 A person who moves from one place to another especially in order to find work or better living conditions

## **Stateless Person**

#### In International Law

- A stateless person is a someone who is not considered as a national by any state under the operation of its law
- Some stateless people are also refugees
- However not all refugees are stateless
- Refugees can become stateless
- Many people who are stateless have never crossed an international border

# Global Displacement Situation (UNHCR – GTR June 2019)

#### Global 70.8 million

- 41.3m IDPs, 25.9m Refugee (92,400 resettled), 3.5m Asylum-Seekers and 3.9m Stateless People
- 80% of refugees live in countries neighboring their country of origin
- 37,000 people a day flee their homes because of conflict and persecution
- Top refugee producing countries Syria 6.7m
   Afghanistan 2.7mSouth Sudan 2.3m, Myanmar 1.1m,
   Somalia 900,000, Sudan 725,000, DRC 720,300
- Top refugee hosting countries Turkey 3.7m, Pakistan 1.4m, Uganda 1.2m, Sudan 1.1m, Germany 1.1m

- 25.2 million Displaced Persons in Africa
- 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of Global Displacements
- 17.4 million IDPs
- 7.4 million Refugees


