SUBJECT: STATUS UPDATE ON ENHANCED CONTINUOUS VOTER REGISTRATION – WEEK 2

The Commission takes this opportunity to once again update the country on the status of the National Enhanced Continuous Voter Registration (ECVR) exercise for the second week ending 17th October 2021.

i) New Registration and Targets

The Commission would like to report that a total of 491,968 being newly registered voters have been enrolled out of the two (2) weeks' target of 3,000,000. This represents a 15.47% achievement.

The performance of the counties in the last two weeks is as shown below:

ii) Voter Transfers

During the period under review the Commission received and serviced a total of 49,656 transfer requests. The Commission would like to remind all registered voters that voter transfer requests will continue being serviced at their constituency of preference. Voters who wish to obtain this service must appear in person before the Registration Officers at the constituency office with originals of their identification documents used during registration as a voter.

There will be NO voter transfer services at the Huduma Centres. The kits at the Huduma Centres have been opened to facilitate registration of new voters to any registration centre/polling station of their choice across the country.

iii) Registration in Universities and Institutions of Higher Learning


The Commission is cognizant of the fact that a good number of the targeted new voters are currently in session at various institutions of higher learning. Consequently, arrangements were therefore made for BVR kits to be deployed in all universities and institutions of higher learning to facilitate registration to vote in polling stations of their choice across the country. The BVR kits will be available in all campuses and other institutions of higher learning based on schedules that have been jointly prepared with students' representatives and shared widely.

The Commission therefore urge all young eligible Kenyans to take advantage of this registration campaign period and register in large numbers.

iv) Conclusion

We applaud various leaders and political parties that have been on the frontline of mobilizing Kenyans to register as voters in solidarity with the Commission and appeal to Kenyans across the board to join in the voter mobilization drive.

The Commission will update the country on the progress of the enhanced voter registration exercise next Monday 25th October 2021.
